Course Syllabus: Academic Writing

1. Course details

The course is a compulsory component of the third-cycle programme in Theatre.

2. Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the third-cycle student shall be able to

- demonstrate familiarity with some established referencing techniques, and adopt a position
 of critical reflection to different types of written discourse and their implications for artistic
 research in theatre
- demonstrate familiarity with established standards of academic integrity and make assessments with regard to research ethics
- present and discuss research and research findings in speech and writing and with artistic authority and well-supported arguments
- demonstrate development of academic writing on artistic research by presenting selected texts in three assessed assignments in accordance with the description below
- provide comments and constructive criticism of texts on artistic research in research studies

3. Course content

The course consists of seven parts, which to some extent run in parallel throughout the course.

- Part 1: Introduction. Overview of the course and of academic writing.
- Part 2: The craft of writing and the aim for clarity.
- Part 3: The quality dimensions of language and writing.
- Part 4: Research ethics. Academic integrity and research misconduct.
- Part 5: Reference management. Practical exercises of critical review of different referencing techniques in selected research publications. Practical exercises in correct reference management.
- Part 6: Individual writing.
- Part 7: Assessment. Presentation and discussion of assessed assignments.

4. Teaching and assessment

The course consists of lectures and seminars, divided into eight separate sessions.

To be awarded a grade of Pass, students must have participated actively in the teaching and passed all assessed components.

The written assignments must include

- (i) a summary and assessment of parts of the required reading (1,500–2,000 words)
- (ii) a presentation and critical review of the written discourse of selected texts of artistic research, using perspectives from the required reading, and discussing and assessing alternative types of written discourse (1,500–2,000 words)
- (iii) a paper on the student's own artistic research project, demonstrating awareness of the perspectives from the required reading and seminar discussion (1,000–2,000 words).

Students will be awarded one of the grades Pass or Fail. To be awarded a grade of Pass, the student must have attained the learning outcomes specified above.
